### About Our Schools

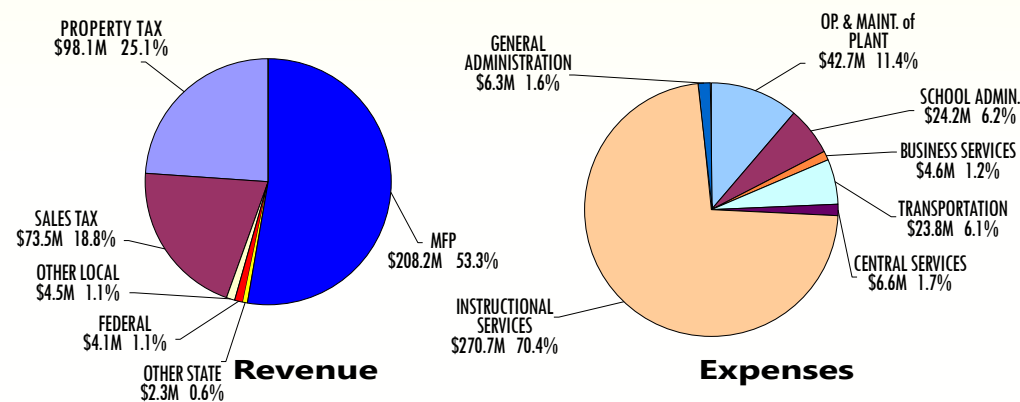
